

Assistant Professor of Security Studies and Criminal Justice

Dean College invites applications for an Assistant Professor of Security Studies and Criminal Justice. This is a 10-month, full-time position renewable annually. Anticipated start date in Fall 2016; a Spring 2016 start date is negotiable.

Responsibilities:

Position reports to the Dean, School of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Faculty duties include, but are not limited to:

- coordination of the Associate degree in Criminal Justice
- assist in the implementation of a four-year program in Criminal Justice & Security Studies
- teaching (minimum of 4 courses per semester);
- hold office hours as required and meet with students by appointment;
- mentor students regarding academic and career/graduate school preparation;
- direct student research projects;
- participate in committees as assigned, attend school and program meetings;
- participate in student recruitment and orientation activities;
- participate in continuing professional development, within and outside of the organization, as well as other school meetings/function;
- perform other related duties as assigned.

Required Skills and Experience:

A Ph.D. in Criminology, Criminal Justice, or another field relevant to Security Studies. At least 3 years of undergraduate teaching experience is required. Candidates must have a demonstrated/proven passion for teaching; providing transformational learning experiences for college students; and teaching to a diverse population of undergraduates at varying stages of academic readiness. The College seeks an exceptional educator with the ability and energy to be a top performer in the classroom and an active professional in the field. Teaching responsibilities include teaching undergraduate courses in criminal justice, courses in security studies both existing and to be developed, and other assigned courses within the prescribed curriculum. Experience with course management systems (i.e., Moodle) and classroom media such as smart boards is essential. Evidence of scholarship and participation within the discipline, specifically professional associations and publications, will be given favorable consideration.
